

When to Contact Emergency Management



- **When an incident is taxing other agencies: Before they get to the point where there is no one to respond to the next call.**
- **If there is a chemical accident at a facility or on a transportation route and results in the release of a reportable quantity of hazardous material.**
- **When an incident involves State Road Closures.**
- **A spill in the Royal Springs Aquifer.**
- **Whatever involves water: Any toxic/petroleum. Any environmental hazardous incident involving water.**
- **Any spill on the periphery of the county that involves any other EMA. Example: Bourbon Co./ Scott Co. to determine jurisdiction.**
- **Any SEVERE WEATHER or PENDING SEVERE WEATHER**
- **To help with notifying Media of Road Closures, Emergency situations. All media releases involving Multi-Agency response or Disaster situations should be presented to EMA before being released to the media.**
- **If a search for a missing person/persons has lasted more than two (2) hours.**
- **When that missing person/persons have been found.**
- **Incident that requires multi-agency response that endangers lives, property, and/or environment.**
- **Any time Central Dispatch loses power or dispatching capabilities.**
- **Any incident that requires State Notification.**
- **Flammable liquid exposure to fire.**
- **Evacuation is required of a structure that taxes agencies.**
- **Evacuation of : School/education facility or health care facilities.**
- **Anytime you are unsure, go ahead and notify EMA.**
